## FY2023 Congressionally Designated Spending Dollars in the FY2023 Government Funding Bill

## U.S. Senators Mark R. Warner and Tim Kaine

- The Senators successfully secured \$3,000,000 for the Virginia Department of
  Transportation's completion of Phase 1 of the Shenandoah Rail Trail, a proposed multiuse trail along the Shenandoah Valley through Warren, Shenandoah, and Rockingham
  Counties.
- The Senators successfully secured \$3,000,000 for Rockbridge County to support the design and construction of a new raw water pump station.
- The Senators successfully secured \$2,000,000 for Amherst County to support the Amherst County Service Authority (ACSA) in their efforts to rehabilitate a publiclyowned interceptor wastewater sewer.
- The Senators successfully secured \$1,500,000 for the Valley Health System in
   Winchester to purchase telehealth equipment to facilitate access to care in rural and
   underserved service areas of the community as well as constructing and renovating a
   2,500 square foot Federally Qualified Health Center, which will allow for five treatment
   areas for behavioral health services. Additionally, funding will be used to renovate
   existing space to increase access to behavioral health services.
- The Senators successfully secured \$1,130,000 to support the Piedmont Housing Alliance's construction of 121 new affordable apartments in Albemarle County, which are part of the first phase of the Southwood Apartments redevelopment.
- The Senators successfully secured \$1,000,000 for the City of Harrisonburg to be used for the design and construction of a raw water and potable water transmission project that will move water from the City of Harrisonburg's Dry River Intake to the Grand View Drive Water Treatment Plant.
- The Senators successfully secured \$921,000 for Shenandoah University in Winchester
  to establish a new Master of Science in Clinical Mental Health Counseling to address the
  shortage of qualified mental health professionals in rural parts of the Commonwealth.
   The Senators successfully secured \$625,000 to support the Piedmont Housing Alliance's
  construction of Friendship Court Early Learning Center to serve residents of a lowincome community in Charlottesville.

- The Senators successfully secured \$500,000 for Albemarle County to aid Virginia
   Supportive Housing in their efforts to provide affordable housing and support services
   to homeless and low-income individuals at Premier Circle Permanent Supportive
   Housing.
- The Senators successfully secured \$500,000 for the Harrisonburg Redevelopment and Housing Authority in their efforts to provide permanent supportive housing at the Commerce Village Annex Permanent Supportive Housing for the elderly, veterans, and persons with disabilities or serious mental illness with low income in Harrisonburg.
- The Senators successfully secured \$500,000 for the Valley Health System (VHS) to
  develop a Health Professionals Training Program in Winchester. VHS will work with
  secondary educational institutions to build graduate counseling programming and
  develop the professionals required to close the care gap and prepare for the growing
  need within rural and underserved communities.
- The Senators successfully secured \$255,000 for the Town of Goshen to purchase property to be renovated into a multi-use community center that will provide services including medical and dental services, a food pantry, social activities, legal services, a remote learning center, and an exercise space, among other community services.
- The Senators successfully secured \$230,000 to aid the University of Virginia in Charlottesville in their efforts to grow and strengthen Virginia's technology workforce by increasing access to UVA's Cloud Computing certificate for underrepresented students.
- The Senators successfully secured \$75,000 to aid the Rockbridge Area Transport System in their purchase of a stretcher van to provide non-emergent medical transport/stretcher transport services in Rockbridge, Alleghany, and Augusta Counties.
