Congressionally Directed Spending in FY2024 Government Funding Bill

- The Senators successfully secured \$4,116,279 for the County of Fairfax to fund a new homeless and domestic violence shelter for families.
- The Senators successfully secured \$4,116,279 for Loudoun County to develop a regional Crisis Receiving and Stabilization Center that will be open 24/7.
- The Senators successfully secured \$2,500,000 to improve the intersection of Minnieville Road and Prince William Parkway in Prince William County to relieve congestion, improve safety, enhance access and connectivity to I-95, Potomac Mills, and Dale City, and support economic development plans for the area.
- The Senators successfully secured \$2,031,000 for the Culpepper Garden Senior Affordable Housing Revitalization Project to renovate affordable senior housing and improve accessibility and safety in Arlington County.
- The Senators successfully secured \$1,360,000 to improve and update the Lake
 Mooney Water Treatment Plant in Stafford County. Specifically, this funding will be
 used for the purchase and installation of water treatment membranes, which are
 barriers that filter unwanted substances, and to provide clean water for Stafford
 County residents.
- The Senators successfully secured \$1,280,000 for the Arlington Partnership for Affordable Housing to create 321 units of new affordable housing in Arlington County. This units will be in a high opportunity zone that is close to job opportunities and public transportation, making it an ideal area for economic mobility.
- The Senators successfully secured \$1,000,000 for the George Mason University Center to develop and establish a program to assist small businesses in capitalizing on Artificial Intelligence (AI) innovations and help train employees to harness AI in Fairfax County.
- The Senators successfully secured \$1,000,000 for the Alexandria Transit Company to fund the construction and implementation of up to two fast chargers within the City of Alexandria. The chargers will be located along bus routes, saving the buses trips to off-





- site facilities for charging.
- The Senators successfully secured \$1,000,000 for the County of Fairfax to fund the construction of an early childhood center at the Original Mount Vernon High School, which will help address gaps in the supply of affordable, high-quality early childhood and school readiness support for children and families with low incomes.
- The Senators successfully secured \$1,000,000 for the Loudoun Citizens for Social
 Justice Inc. to build a new shelter for survivors of domestic violence in Loudoun
 County.
- The Senators successfully secured \$1,000,000 for the Capital Area Food Bank for construction of a new, state-of-the-art, 45,000-square foot facility in Lorton, Virginia that serves low- and moderate-income families throughout the National Capital region.
- The Senators successfully secured \$1,000,000 for the Virginia Department of Transportation to realign 0.45 miles of Onville Road, provide 12-foot travel lanes, a two-way left-turn lane, and a sidewalk along both sides of the road in **Stafford County.**
- The Senators successfully secured \$1,000,000 for the Virginia Department of Transportation to accelerate the preliminary engineering for the development of the planned interchange on US Route 50 at Route 606 Loudoun County Parkway.
- The Senators successfully secured \$1,000,000 for the Virginia Department of Transportation to widen and reconstruct Spring Street from four to six lanes between Herndon Parkway and Fairfax County Parkway in Fairfax County.
- The Senators successfully secured \$963,000 for the Prince William County Department of Public Safety Commission to achieve maximum benefits of their 911 system upgrade by upgrading the legacy call handling equipment in Prince William County.
- The Senators successfully secured \$963,000 for the City of Alexandria to develop an urban living-learning laboratory, in close proximity to Virginia Tech's Innovation Campus, to test and better understand transportation-related smart technologies.
- The Senators successfully secured \$959,757 for the City of Manassas Park to restore approximately 1,635 feet of a tributary of Russia Branch stream, which will reduce pollutant runoff in the Chesapeake Bay watershed.
- The Senators successfully secured \$921,000 to support George Mason University's
 Center for Health Workforce to serve as the Centralized Technical Assistance hub for
 regional health workforce development throughout Fairfax County and Virginia. This
 will help train more health care workers and address workforce shortages by providing
 resources, like technical and planning assistance, to regions throughout Virginia.
- The Senators successfully secured \$850,000 for the Virginia Department of
 Transportation to connect existing facilities at Ninian Avenue and along Bush Hill
 Drive north of Larno Drive in Fairfax County to improve safety and accessibility for
 children walking and bicycling to school from the northeast of Bush Hill Elementary
 School.
- The Senators successfully secured \$850,000 to build a roundabout connecting





- Stefaniga Road and Lightfoot Drive with Mountain View Road, a main thoroughfare which provides access to I-95 and Mountain View High School in **Stafford County**. The project will improve walkability and make it easier to travel to the area.
- The Senators successfully secured \$850,000 for the City of Falls Church to fund affordable housing construction projects.
- The Senators successfully secured \$850,000 for the City of Alexandria to renovate a boarding house to preserve 10 deeply affordable rental housing units.
- The Senators successfully secured \$763,000 for Specially Adapted Resource Clubs (SPARC) to expand services to increase the ability of adults with developmental disabilities to thrive in their communities. SPARC will use the money to build two locations in Alexandria and one location in Leesburg.
- The Senators successfully secured \$720,000 for the Virginia Department of
 Transportation to construct a multi-use trail on the south side of Arlington
 Boulevard between South George Mason Drive and South Glebe Road in Arlington
 County.
- The Senators successfully secured \$500,000 for the Virginia Department of Transportation to install a shared-use path adjacent to Gunston Road from Julia Taft Way to the entrance to the Pohick Bay Golf Course in Fairfax County.
- The Senators successfully secured \$500,000 for the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers to initiate a feasibility study that will examine options for a secondary drinking water source for the Washington, D.C. metropolitan area.
- The Senators successfully secured \$500,000 for the Melwood Horticultural Training Center to redevelop an aging former school into 100 units of affordable housing in Arlington. 30 units will be set aside for individuals with disabilities.
- The Senators successfully secured \$500,000 for the Virginia Department of Transportation to widen 0.65 miles of US-1 to create left-turn lanes in the Courthouse area and install an 8-foot sidewalk along both sides of US-1 in Stafford County.
- The Senators successfully secured \$500,000 for the Virginia Department of
 Transportation to add a bicycle/pedestrian path along Compton Road to connect
 the Bull Run Special Events Center Access Road to the Cub Run Stream Valley Trail
 in Fairfax County.
- The Senators successfully secured \$500,000 for the Virginia Department of
 Transportation to install 12-foot tall streetlights along 1.25 miles of the Washington &
 Old Dominion (W&OD) Trail from Catoctin Circle to the east of downtown Leesburg to
 Catoctin Circle at Loudoun County High School.
- The Senators successfully secured \$359,000 for Loudoun County Community Health Center to purchase radiology equipment and to renovate an imaging room at their HealthWorks facility located in Leesburg.
- The Senators successfully secured \$326,000 for United Community Ministries to provide enhanced workforce readiness skills for English learners through job training,





- digital literacy, and English as a Second Language and English Conversation classes in **Mount Vernon.**
- The Senators successfully secured \$246,000 to upgrade Stafford County's Emergency Police Dispatch system, which would enable local police dispatchers to collect additional information in order to better tailor individual call response.
