3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "Head Start for Our5 Future Act".

SEC. 2. CHILD DEVELOPMENT AND EARLY LEARNING COM MUNITY SERVICES THROUGH FEDERAL WORK-STUDY PROGRAMS. (a) IN GENERAL.—Section 441(c)(1) of the Higher

5 Education Act of 1965 (20 U.S.C. 1087–51(c)(1)) is
6 amended by striking "literacy training" and inserting
7 "child development and early learning (including Head
8 Start programs and Early Head Start programs carried
9 out under the Head Start Act (42 U.S.C. 9831 et seq.)),
10 literacy training".

(b) AGREEMENT REQUIREMENTS.—Section 443(b) of
the Higher Education Act of 1965 (20 U.S.C. 1087–
13 53(b)) is amended—

14 (1) in paragraph (10), by striking "and" after15 the semicolon;

16 (2) by redesignating paragraph (11) as para-17 graph (12); and

18 (3) by adding at the end the following:

"(11) provide assurances that any Head Start
program, including an Early Head Start program,
employing students through a work-study program
under this part will comply with the requirements of
sections 645A(j) and 648A(h), respectively, of the
Head Start Act (42 U.S.C. 9840a(j), 9843a(h));
and".

1SEC. 3. HEAD START AND EARLY HEAD START REQUIRE-2MENTS.

3 (a) EARLY HEAD START.—Section 645A of the Head
4 Start Act (42 U.S.C. 9840a) is amended by adding at the
5 end the following:

6 "(j) STUDENTS IN WORK-STUDY PROGRAMS.—In the
7 case of a student serving an Early Head Start program
8 through a work-study program under section 441(c)(1) of
9 the Higher Education Act of 1965 (20 U.S.C. 1087–
10 51(c)(1))—

"(1) before the Early Head Start agency involved employs the student, the agency shall comply
with the requirements of section 648A(g)(3);

"(2) the student shall comply with all personnel
policies applicable to the Early Head Start program
under the Head Start program performance standards issued under this subchapter; and

18 "(3) the student shall serve the Early Head
19 Start program as an additional paid staff member
20 but—

21 "(A) shall not be left alone with any child
22 through the program, meaning that a paid staff
23 member (not in such a work-study program)
24 shall attend when the student so serves; and
25 "(B) shall not count toward the staff in26 cluded in any staff-to-child ratio applicable to

the Early Head Start program under this sub chapter.".

3 (b) HEAD START.—Section 648A of the Head Start
4 Act (42 U.S.C. 9843a) is amended by adding at the end
5 the following:

6 "(h) STUDENTS IN WORK-STUDY PROGRAMS.—In
7 the case of a student serving a Head Start program (not
8 an Early Head Start program) through a work-study pro9 gram under section 441(c)(1) of the Higher Education Act
10 of 1965 (20 U.S.C. 1087–51(c)(1))—

"(1) before the Head Start agency involved employs the student, the agency shall comply with the
requirements of subsection (g)(3);

"(2) the student shall comply with all personnel
policies applicable to the Head Start program under
the Head Start program performance standards
issued under this subchapter; and

18 "(3) the student shall serve the Head Start pro-19 gram as an additional paid staff member but—

20 "(A) shall not be left alone with any child
21 through the program, meaning that a paid staff
22 member (not in such a work-study program)
23 shall attend when the student so serves; and

24 "(B) shall not count toward the staff in-25 cluded in any staff-to-child ratio applicable to

1the Head Start program under this sub-2chapter.".
