

Congressionally Directed Spending in FY2026 Government Funding Bill

Hampton Roads

The senators successfully secured:

- **\$15,000,000** for Naval Station **Norfolk** to support construction of substations, associated power stations, and related infrastructure at Pier 14 to support aircraft carrier operations.
- **\$12,000,000** for JEB Little Creek-Fort Story in the **City of Virginia Beach** to support construction of a new multi-story, multi-facility complex with operational, maintenance, planning, and storage space to accommodate new Expeditionary Mine Countermeasure (ExMCM) mission requirements assigned to Explosive Ordnance Disposal Mobile Unit (EODMU) TWELVE and consolidated Mobile Diving & Salvage Unit (MDSU) TWO mission requirements.
- **\$10,000,000** for the Virginia Department of Transportation to analyze proposals to improve the I-264/Independence Boulevard corridor in **Virginia Beach** and design a new interchange to improve safety and decrease congestion.
- **\$6,900,000** for NSA Northwest Annex in **Chesapeake** to support the planning and design of a new 250-person enlisted quarters for military personnel.
- **\$5,445,000** to perform maintenance dredging to maintain a depth of 55 feet from the **Norfolk Harbor to Craney Island** and perform maintenance dredging to maintain a depth of 56 feet at **Thimble Shoal Channel**.
- **\$4,000,000** for Preconstruction, Engineering, and Design (PED) activities for the Elizabeth River and Southern Branch Deepening project in the **City of Norfolk**.
- **\$2,000,000** for Preconstruction, Engineering, and Design (PED) activities for the North Landing Bridge Replacement project in the **City of Chesapeake**.
- **\$2,000,000** for Colonial Behavioral Health to support the construction of a new health care campus that will provide integrated primary, behavioral, and oral health care, as well as pharmacy services, to Virginians in **James City County and across the surrounding region**.
- **\$2,000,000** for necessary maintenance dredging for the federal navigation channel at Winter Harbor in **Matthews County**.

- **\$2,200,000** for Naval Weapons Station **Yorktown** to support the construction of a new utility substation at Pier R3, which will dock Virginia-class submarines.
- **\$1,600,000** to support William & Mary's Virginia Institute of Marine Science forecasting work in **Gloucester County**.
- **\$1,500,000** for Old Dominion University in the **City of Norfolk** to purchase equipment and build infrastructure to establish the Center for Excellence in Trustworthy Artificial Intelligence, which will conduct research and education related to AI.
- **\$1,500,000** for the Foodbank of **Southeastern Virginia and the Eastern Shore** to construct a new facility to expand access to food and close the food insecurity gap across the region.
- **\$1,500,000** for the Virginia Department of Transportation to install sidewalks and make drainage improvements along Townpoint Road in the **City of Suffolk**, allowing safe pedestrian passage along the corridor and providing a safer bus stop for school children.
- **\$1,300,000** for **Northampton County** to replace and upgrade a septic system in a building that is being converted into a community center.
- **\$1,250,000** for the **City of Suffolk** to replace failing sanitary sewer and potable water mains.
- **\$1,150,000** for the **City of Chesapeake** to improve pedestrian safety on Myers Road by adding sidewalks, curbs, and ramps from Atlantic Avenue to Lyons Avenue.
- **\$1,000,000** for the Virginia Department of Transportation to procure and install signal system components and optimize signal timing to decrease congestion and increase safety throughout the **City of Newport News**.
- **\$1,000,000** for the **City of Norfolk** to support construction of a new affordable housing development at the former Globe Iron Site.
- **\$1,000,000** for the **City of Suffolk** to replace and relocate a 15-inch vitrified sanitary sewer truck line that flows to the Nansemond River.
- **\$1,000,000** for the **City of Virginia Beach** to design, acquire, and construct a park with stormwater storage, flood barriers, and storm drains.
- **\$925,000** for **James City County** to demolish three blighted properties on Moses Lane and allow for future affordable workforce and housing development.
- **\$850,000** for the Virginia Department of Transportation's **Hampton Roads** Transit to purchase new paratransit vehicles, which will improve individuals with disabilities' access to public transportation and ensure compliance with the *Americans with Disabilities Act*.
- **\$750,000** for **Children's Hospital of the King's Daughters** (CHKD) to support programming, training, and equipment at its Child Advocacy Center. This will expand CHKD's child abuse and neglect services to meet the increasing need for care and ensure CHKD can provide the latest evidence-based practices and trauma-informed treatments.
- **\$750,000** for Hampton Roads Sanitation District to improve three pump stations to provide reliable service and operation for the wastewater collection system in the **Town of Onancock**.

- **\$735,000** for Tidewater Community College in **Virginia Beach** to update its spaces and technology to train Emergency Medical Services (EMS) and Emergency Medical Technicians (EMT) professionals.
- **\$700,000** for the Hampton Roads Ecumenical Lodgings & Provisions, Inc to increase the availability of affordable housing in **Hampton** for individuals with disabilities, seniors, and veterans experiencing or at risk of homelessness.
- **\$629,834** for Southampton County to install an upgraded radio system for police, fire, and emergency services, increasing the interoperability between **Southampton County** and the **City of Franklin**.
- **\$600,000** for the **City of Williamsburg** to make improvements to collection sewers.
- **\$500,000** for the **City of Chesapeake**'s Schooner Trail Park to add a playground, picnic shelter, and more trees.
- **\$500,000** to initiate a General Reevaluation Report to reexamine potential options to fortify communities in the **City of Norfolk** as part of Norfolk's Coastal Storm Risk Management project.
- **\$375,000** for Williamsburg Regional Library to expand its library services to youth and adults in **James City County** through its bookmobile.
- **\$151,000** for **Gloucester Mathews Care Clinic** to create a nursing station and replace aging equipment, including two HVAC systems and a generator.
