

# Congressionally Directed Spending in FY2026 Government Funding Bill

## *Northern Virginia*

The senators successfully secured:

- **\$1,800,000** for the **City of Alexandria** to continue a feasibility study that will examine options for a secondary drinking water source for the Washington, D.C. metropolitan area.
- **\$1,092,000** for the **City of Falls Church** to construct a flow equalization basin to prevent sewage overflow or the discharge of raw sewage.
- **\$1,092,000** for Upper Occoquan Service Authority to improve infrastructure at the septic waste receiving facility in **Fairfax County**.
- **\$1,039,000** for **Stafford County** to replace 345 mobile radios utilized in sheriff patrol vehicles.
- **\$1,031,000** for the **Fairfax County** Police Department's Real Time Crime Center to upgrade its technological operational capabilities, improving its ability to respond to and prevent criminal activities and emerging threats.
- **\$1,031,000** for the **City of Alexandria** to establish an emergency shelter backup energy generation system.
- **\$1,027,000** for **George Mason University** to develop domestic violence training tools, including new technology like virtual reality simulations, to assist law enforcement, social workers, and other frontline professionals in responding to domestic violence situations.
- **\$1,000,000** for Boulder Crest Foundation in **Loudoun County** to support the development and implementation of peer-led mental wellness training programs, focused on suicide prevention and stress management, for law enforcement officers.
- **\$500,000** for the **Town of Leesburg**'s mobile command unit responsible for facilitating coordination with public safety agencies in response to National Capital Region large-scale disasters. The unit will also provide backup to the emergency communications center and support community policing outreach and events.
- **\$460,000** for FailSafe-ERA to support evidence-based pre- and post-release reentry programs for individuals at **Rappahannock Regional Jail**.
