

Congressionally Directed Spending in FY2026 Government Funding Bill

The senators successfully secured:

- **\$1,500,000** for Feed More in the **City of Richmond** to increase its distribution capacity, expand access to food, and close the food insecurity gap across the region.
- **\$1,454,000** for the Virginia Department of Transportation's Fall Line Trail Segment 4A, a regional trail project that improves multimodal transportation and encourages tourism by connecting the **City of Richmond** and **Chesterfield County**.
- **\$1,000,000** for the **Northern Neck-Middlesex** Free Health Clinic to expand access to dental services for people with disabilities.
- **\$850,000** for the **City of Richmond** to improve stormwater management in Shockoe, supporting economic development opportunities.
- **\$750,000** for Health Brigade in the **City of Richmond** to make repairs and upgrades to its aging building.
- **\$500,000** for Habitat for Humanity – **Powhatan** to support the construction of affordable homes in the Ballsville Road neighborhood.
- **\$500,000** for SupportWorks Housing to provide 82 units of high-quality, safe, and affordable housing with on-site supportive services in the **City of Richmond**.
- **\$400,000** for CrossOver Healthcare Ministry to expand access to dental services for low-income residents across **Central Virginia**.
- **\$351,000** for Daily Planet Health Services to upgrade HVAC systems at two Federally Qualified Health Centers (FQHCs) in the **City of Richmond**.
- **\$296,000** for Brightpoint Community College to expand its training laboratory capacity in **Midlothian** and **Chester** and support growing the health care workforce.
- **\$250,000** for **Richmond** International Airport to support the reconstruction of its Passenger Terminal Apron.
- **\$200,000** for ReadyKids, Inc in **Charlottesville** to expand access to youth mental health counseling.
- **\$200,000** for Boys to Men Mentoring Network of Virginia, Inc. to expand access to its mentoring services at local elementary schools.
