**A BILL**

To require the Social Security Administration to make changes to the social security terminology used in the rules, regulation, guidance, or other materials of the Administration.

1       *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2       *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3       **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4       This Act may be cited as the “\_\_\_\_\_ Act”.

5       **SEC. 2. CHANGES TO SOCIAL SECURITY TERMINOLOGY.**

6       Not later than January 1, 2025, the Commissioner  
7       of Social Security shall ensure that, in any rules, regula-

1 tion, guidance, or other materials of the Social Security  
2 Administration, whether online or in print—

3           (1) the term “early eligibility age” is replaced  
4 with the term “minimum benefit age”;

5           (2) the terms “full retirement age” and “nor-  
6 mal retirement age” are replaced with the term  
7 “standard benefit age”; and

8           (3) the term “delayed retirement credit” shall  
9 not be used and any reference to age 70 as the max-  
10 imum age up to which delayed retirement credits  
11 can be received shall be replaced with the term  
12 “maximum benefit age”.
