FY2023 Congressionally Designated Spending Dollars in the Senate Appropriations Bill

- The Senators successfully secured \$10,696,000 in the Senate appropriations bill for the Army
 Corps of Engineers to complete additional necessary operations and maintenance along the
 James River Channel in Richmond.
- The Senators successfully secured \$3,203,000 in the Senate appropriations bill for the City of Petersburg to upgrade its existing 20-year-old Mission Critical Communication system that coordinates emergency services for all first responders in the City and surrounding areas.
- The Senators successfully secured \$1,500,000 in the Senate appropriations bill to support the Life Sciences Commercialization, Training and Capacity-Building Initiative at the Virginia Biotechnology Research Partnership in Richmond, which will directly create and save a combined 69 jobs. This funding will be used to support the purchase of lab equipment, develop a specialized commercialization training program, and fund a capacity-building partnership to expand regional competencies in life sciences business formation.
- The Senators successfully secured \$1,000,000 in the Senate appropriations bill for Chesterfield County, which will be used to support the Better Housing Coalition's efforts to provide affordable housing and support services for homeless and low-income individuals at the Colbrook Family Apartments.
- The Senators successfully secured \$700,000 in the Senate appropriations bill for the City of Richmond's Main Street Station. This funding will enable facility upgrades that will improve the safety and security of rail passengers and station visitors.
- The Senators successfully secured \$694,000 in the Senate appropriations bill for students at Richard Bland College from Petersburg, Dinwiddie, Prince George, and Hopewell Counties. The funding will support the College's Guided Pathways for Success program by enabling services, education and training and job placement for students from rural areas, underrepresented STEM groups, and students highly impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic.
- The Senators successfully secured \$500,000 in the Senate appropriations bill for the City of
 Richmond to stabilize the Byrd Park Pump House to make it more available for public use and to
 preserve it for future generations. Byrd Park Pump House is a 19th century Gothic Revival
 building listed on the National Register for Historic Places and a Virginia Landmark that once
 housed the city's waterworks on its first floor and a dance hall on the second floor. Stabilization

- will expand the number of visitors who can access the building beyond the current limit of 25. Stabilization is the first phase of a larger renovation project.
- The Senators successfully secured \$500,000 in the Senate appropriations bill for the Southside Community Development & Housing Corporation in Petersburg. The funding will go towards the Petersburg Virginia High Street Apartments to provide permanent supportive housing for individuals experiencing homelessness.
- The Senators successfully secured \$188,000 in the Senate appropriations bill for the City of Hopewell to replace the functionally obsolete standby generator at City Hall.
